H. Motion condemning Monash University's research into nuclear-propelled submarines

<u>Preamble</u>: Monash University has embarked on research activities into the corrosion mechanisms of nuclear fuel cladding material, primarily aiming to aid the development of nuclear-propelled submarines.



This initiative directly contributes to the recently announced AUKUS pact, under which Australia is set to acquire nuclear submarines for the first time in history. The significant taxpayer cost of this defence endeavour is projected to range from \$268 billion to \$368 billion over the next three decades, posing a substantial financial burden on the nation.

This research has deep ethical implications, considering that the end results could contribute to the intensification of global military competition and potential conflict.

Furthermore, these defence investments come at a time when Australia, like many other nations, is grappling with pressing economic issues including a rising cost of living and inflation, putting increasing financial pressure on Australian families and students.

The allocation of these funds might be more beneficial if redirected towards initiatives that strengthen diplomatic ties with neighbouring nations, improve public health, enhance social services, and provide affordable education and housing - sectors that directly benefit the Australian people.

Motion #4:

This MSC formally condemns the university's participation in research that may directly or indirectly contribute to global military competition and potential conflict, and encourages the University to carefully consider the ethical implications of such research.

The MSA calls upon Monash University to uphold its commitment to peace and non-conflict by conducting a thorough ethical review of its current and future involvement in military-related research, with a focus on its nuclear materials research.

Further, the MSA requests the university administration to take into account the economic consequences of the aforementioned nuclear submarine program, weigh it against other potential benefits of directing research and resources towards other areas vital to Australian society and the international community.

And further resolved that, the MSA urges the university to increase transparency regarding its involvement in defence-related research projects and to facilitate open and inclusive dialogue among all stakeholders - students, faculty, and the wider community - regarding its research priorities and their societal implications.
