Psychopomp: from the Greek word ψυχοπομπός (psychopompos), literally meaning the "guide of soul". Psychopomps are creatures, spirits, angels, or deities in many religions whose responsibility it is to escort newly deceased souls to the afterlife.

Their role is not to judge the deceased, but simply provide safe passage. Psychopomp is a quartet for four voices. Not sung but spoken. Each of the four voices is trying to understand what it was that brought them to this place. And through it all the psychopomps are watching.
